Principal's Message

Hello Skyeeeeehawks!

Aristotle said, "Educating the Mind without educating the Heart is no education at all". For ancient Greek society, education revolved around a heathy self-awareness: The learner must declare their ignorance and seek wisdom from the teacher. For Aristotle, the foundation of the teacher-learner relationship is based upon humility. The Greeks also believed that the greatest character flaw of a person is *hubris* (excessive pride), which is illustrated in a number of Greek plays called *tragedies*. Pride often caused the tragic downfall of a talented and gifted person. *Humility* is at the core of great educational teams, and it is our Positive Project Character Strength of focus.

The word "narcissist" comes from the Greek myth of Narcissus, a young man who falls in love with his own reflection. Life doesn't go well for him. American society has overemphasized *the love of self* to the point that narcissism is up 30% since the early 1980s. Narcissism, a fragile and defensive variety of self -esteem, is correlated with feelings of entitlement and a belief that all one's failures are a result of external factors. In other words, narcissists have a difficult time taking ownership of their behavior and the consequences to their behavior. A narcissistic lens makes it difficult for a person to learn and grow from others, and it's hard for this person to appreciate the talents and gifts others. Humility, then, is vital to team, community, and academic achievement. Educational teams, composed of humble people, do what's necessary without making a big deal of it—always keeping focused on what's best for everyone.

Humility is associated with individual growth. It allows a person to honestly reflect on their weaknesses and how they can improve. Humility opens us up to new ideas, advice, and abilities that pride and arrogance often block. A good teacher humbles him or herself to understand the student's strengths and weaknesses, and a student humbles him or herself to submit to the authority and wisdom of the teacher. Both are needed for the classroom. Students who are humble are better learners. Adults who are humble are better teachers. Adults and students, who join together in humility, create a powerful learning environment.

This is the purpose for the Parent-Teacher conference, which occurred last week. In humility, adults met to learn how best to support student growth. Thank you for your humble participation.
